



Managing Mandatory Amendments

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Did you know that you are required to file a mandatory amendment to your Notice of Intent if your asbestos project ends earlier than the completion date of record?

You may be asking yourself, "Why make a completion date a mandatory amendment if the work is complete?"

An accurate completion date helps Spokane Clean Air manage its resources wisely. Our inspectors use the project start and end dates to plan inspections and a failure to provide accurate dates results in lost field time.

Which brings up this related topic, "When Is an Asbestos Project Complete?"

An asbestos project is complete when the last controlled area associated with the project is returned to public or normal occupancy (e.g. warning signs, warning tape, containment walls, etc. are properly removed) and no more asbestos-containing materials/waste materials have been identified for removal.

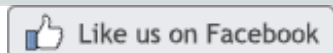
Therefore, an asbestos project is considered to be ongoing during clearance air monitoring, post abatement inspections, etc. and/or there are more asbestos-containing materials listed for removal (i.e. phased work).
